

Human Subjects Training Requirements

Human Subjects Training is required for all Investigators, Faculty, Staff and Students conducting research with human subjects at the University of Arizona.

There are two CITI Training options for Investigators to choose from, depending on the type of research they will be conducting:

Social & Behavioral Research BASIC Course or Biomedical Research BASIC Course





Required for: Non-Medical Surveys, Interviews, etc.

Required for: FDA & Medical Records Reviews

<u>Important:</u> Training must be appropriate for the study design. HSPP requires all studies conducting **FDA regulated research** or projects accessing **Medical Records** to complete the Biomedical Research Investigators BASIC Course. For non-FDA regulated studies and projects not accessing medical records, HSPP will accept either the Biomedical or the Social & Behavioral human subjects research training courses.

- Both training courses include the **Native American Research Module**, which is required training for all University of Arizona researchers.
- Both CITI certificates are valid for **four (4) years**, after which **refresher** training must be completed.
- Please keep a copy of your training certificate for your records.
